

Greetings fellow Lions in 14-L,

I met with the Newry Lions last week and was warmly welcomed by club president Mike Klock and their respective members. The Newry Lions club was chartered in 1956 and currently has 26 members. The club owns a 17-acre plot with playground equipment and a ball field with a substantial clubhouse building where the club meets on the 2nd Thursday each month. The clubhouse is frequently rented out to local community groups which provides the club with extra revenue.

The members described one of their biggest fund-raising events, "Bark in the Park' that benefits the Central PA Humane Society and Mending Hearts. Dogs from shelters enjoy a day out on the Newry Lions property with many vendors and 100s of people from the local community. Their most recent "Bark in the Park" event brought in 3 new club members.

My message to the club was a sober accounting of our current District status and the fact our district has recently lost 2 clubs with a few other clubs teetering on the edge. On a brighter note, I mentioned that there are leadership opportunities in our district including Zone Chair positions that need to be filled by willing and able Lions. I was encouraged that several club members asked me to describe the role and responsibilities of the Zone chair and hopefully one of the members and potentially other Lions in our district will show interest in taking one of those positions.

All in all, I was impressed by the Newry Lions, their obvious dedication to helping their local community and continued success was marked by enthusiasm and a willingness to grow their club membership.


Election and Reporting of Club Officers

Your club nominations meeting is held in March, with your club members voting on the new officers in April. After the election, your Secretary should then enter all officers for the next term (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022) in The Portal, or to the District Administrator prior to May 15, 2021. All officers, whether remaining in a position or newly elected, need to be entered in. This ensures that the new or existing club officers will start receiving information valuable to their position or their club on July 1, 2021 – the start of the new Lions year. Without this step your club will show that it hasn't designated officers for the upcoming year.

Clubs are encouraged to review the LCI Standard Club Constitution and By-Laws. This document provides your Lions Club guidance on the Nominations and Elections, Duties of Officers and your Board of Directors. There is a special webpage created for each of the positions below to make it easier to get to the resources that will help you be successful in your unique club leadership position. 



Wine & Cheese Pairing by Capra Collina Winery - Pre-Registration and payment of \$15 is required. This will be held on site at the Conference Center.




