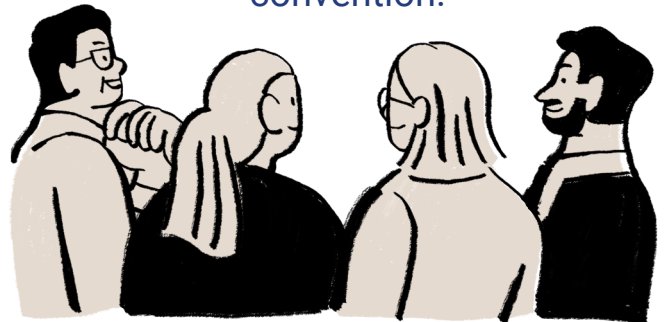
DISTRICT CONVENTION!!

and workshops, Weddings and special events.

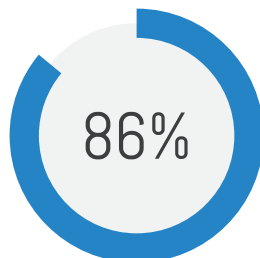

In the top right corner click on Lion Portal

New users click on Don't Have An Account?

Enter your Name and Email

Head over to your email and look for an email, and check you spam folder.

Secretaries/Club Administrators

Once logged in click on the "My Club" option.

From here you have a list of options such as Details, Members, Officers, Data Export, Service Activities, and Statements. To add/drop/edit/transfer a member click on "Members".

From here click "Members" and follow the prompts.

To edit your Officers, click the "Officers" tab then click "Manage Officers" and follow the prompts

Treasurers/Club Administrators

Once logged in click on the "My Club" option.

Click on "Statements" to view current statements from Lions International. On the right side above your total you can pay online. Click on the "Pay with PayPal" or "Pay Now" to pay.

Service Chairperson/Club Administrators

Once logged in click on the "My Club" option.

Click on "Service Activities" to view your club service metrics.

To report a new service activity click "Create Service Activity" at the right and follow the prompts.

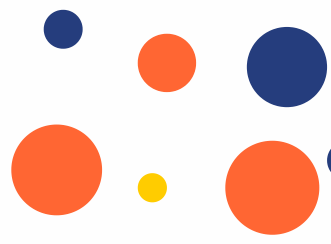
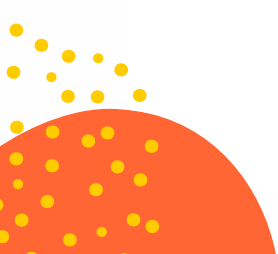
ALL Lions
