GREETINGS FELLOW LIONS IN 14-L,

AS WE CLOSE OUT OUR 2023-24 LIONS YEAR I WANT TO TALK ABOUT CLUB PARTICIPATION IN DISTRICT EVENTS NAMELY ZONE MEETINGS, DISTRICT CABINET MEETINGS AND DISTRICT CONVENTIONS. WHEN I BEGAN MY LIONS JOURNEY IN 2016, I DID NOT ATTEND DISTRICT EVENTS AS THEY WERE BARELY MENTIONED. AS A NEW ZONE CHAIR 3 YEARS AGO, I PLANNED AND EXECUTED 2 ZONE SOCIALS WHICH WERE SUCCESSFUL. HOWEVER, WE WERE EXPECTING BIGGER TURNOUTS BASED ON THE 8 CLUBS IN MY ZONE.

THAT BRINGS ME TO NOT ONLY ZONE MEETINGS OR SOCIALS BUT DISTRICT CABINET MEETINGS AND THE CONVENTION. MORE CLUB MEMBERSHIP PARTICIPATION IN CABINET MEETINGS AND CONVENTIONS IS VITAL FOR MANY REASONS. FIRST, CLUB OFFICERS NEED TO PARTICIPATE IN THESE MEETINGS TO VOICE THEIR CONCERNS OR IDENTIFY ISSUES THAT THE DISTRICT MAY BE ABLE TO ASSIST IN RESOLVING. SECONDLY, CLUB OFFICERS CAN TAKE PART IN AND INFLUENCE DECISIONS AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL THAT HAVE A DIRECT IMPACT ON THEIR RESPECTIVE CLUBS.

THE MAIN ISSUE I SEE AS A PROBLEM IS THAT LACK OF PARTICIPATION AND COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE CLUBS AND THE DISTRICT LEADS TO A CLUB'S ISOLATION AND NOT RECEIVING VITAL INFORMATION AND RESOURCES THAT CLUBS CAN USE TO INCREASE MEMBERSHIP THROUGH OUR GLOBAL ACTION TEAM NETWORK. THE DISTRICT NEEDS TO KNOW IF CLUBS ARE HAVING TROUBLE MAINTAINING CURRENT MEMBERSHIP LEVELS, IS FINANCIALLY SOUND OR HAVING DIFFICULTY PLANNING AND EXECUTING SERVICE PROJECTS.

DG VISITATION SCHEDULE



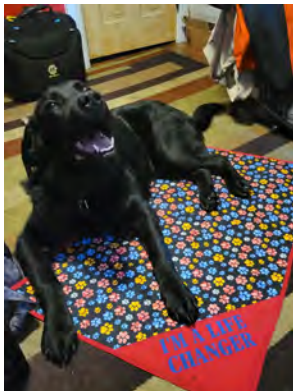

Key dates

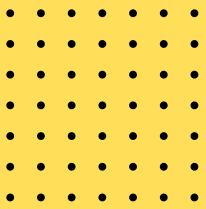
- **April 12 and beyond:** MyLion, MyLCI, and Insights are no longer available.

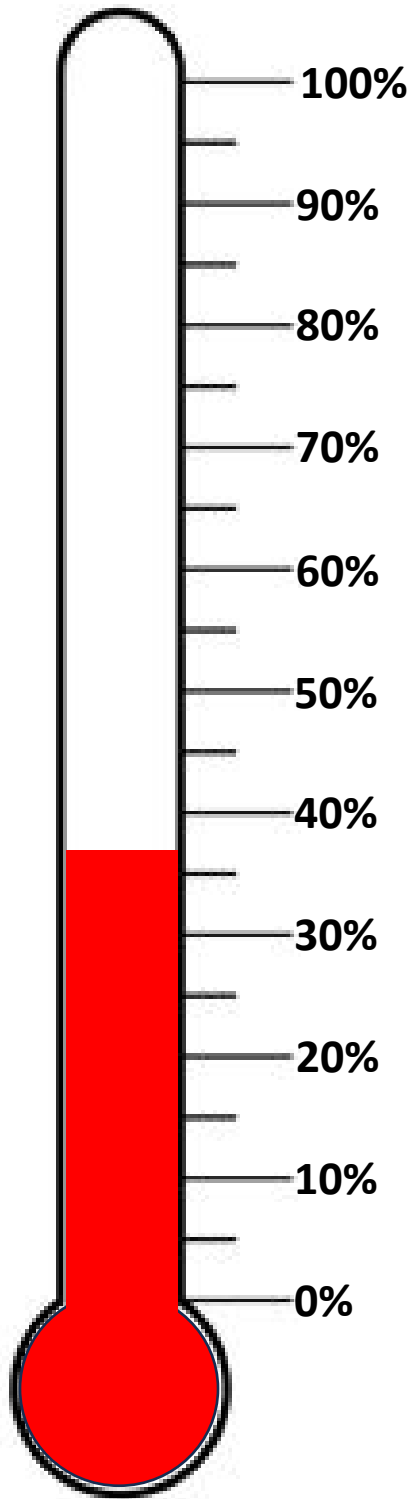

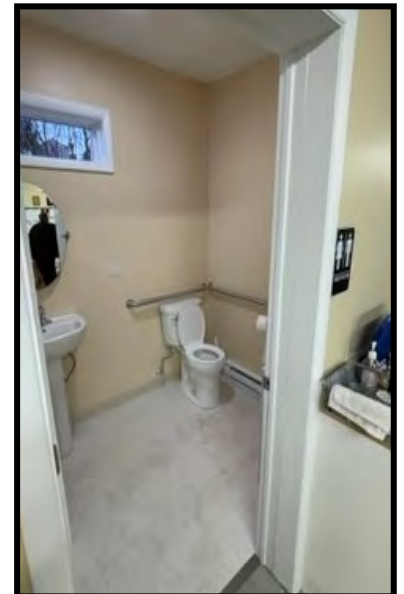
